DON GARDNER (Tru-Glo-Town 1001)

I WANTA KNOW WHERE DID OUR LOVE GO (2:47) [Toote Town, BMI—Townsend] Don Gardner could go big nationally with this soulfilled, melodic, tear-jerking tale of lost love. Watch for quick reaction in both the pop and R&B markets.

WHO'S AFRAID? (2:57)

new dimensions to the tune.

Best Bets

BETTY EVERETT (ABC-Paramount 10829)

IN YOUR ARMS (2:36)
[Screen Gems-Columbia, BMI—S. & T. Loricchio]
—Powers, Fischoff] Vet hitmaker could regain her former prominence with this side. Tune is a warmhearted, appealing blues with effective ork and vocal arrangements.

INEED YOU (2:40) [Gomba, BMI—S. & T. Loricchio] Powerpacked, teen-oriented romancer potently read and played by the Tartans. The solid sound should get this side played often.

KING RICHARD'S FLUEGEL KNIGHTS (MTA 107)

A SIGN OF THE TIMES
(2:22) Duchess, BMI—Hatch]
King Richard's Fluegel Knights stand
a good chance to score big with this
walloper. Deck is a lively, "Tijuana"sounding version of the former Petula
Clark biggie and should get lots of attention.

(B+) ENGLAND SWINGS (2:38) [Tree, BMI—Miller] Similar treatment on the Roger Miller smash.

B+3 (Canadian American 200)

TABOO (2:19) [Sea-Lark, BMI—Levin, Sheppard] Plenty of spinners and consumers should be out for this deck, giving it a shot at big chart action. The wild, galloping sound and infectious arrangement make this one an item to watch.

(B+) WHY OH WHY (2:45) [Brass, BMI—Gardos, Laing] Plaintive, lowdown weeper.

MAE WEST (Tower 261)

IF YOU GOTTA GO (2:50)
[Harms, ASCAP—Dylan] The amazing Mae West should get spins aplenty from this highly unusual deck. She renders the tune in her injunitable sex tinged style inimitable, sex tinged style.

THE MAN BEHIND THE RED BALLOON (2:56) [Trousdale, BMI—Sloan] Well done, highly different ditty back here.

RUBY WINTERS (Diamond 207)

IN THE MIDDLE OF A

Ruby Winters should score sales in both the pop and R&B markets with this powerful, rhythmic sweeping romancer. The lark's soulfilled reading of the lyric gives the side loads of listening appeal. of the lyric give listening appeal.

TARTANS (Impact 1010)

SUMMERTIME (2:08) [American, BMI—Covhran, Capehart] Tom and the Cats could stir lots of sales with the teens with this bluesy rocker that packs tons of danceability. Watch this driving side closely.

(B+) WALKIN' MAN (1:48) [Su-Ma, BMI---Rodie] Medium-paced rocker back here.

TRADE WINDS (Kama Sutra 212)

MIND EXCURSION (2:15) [Tender Tunes, BMI—Andreoli, Poncia] The Trade Winds could cause lots of excitement with this lilting, infectious ditty about the powers of mind over matter. The unreal scene is effectively instilled by the smooth lyric.

THE DEEP SIX (Liberty 55901)

WHY SAY GOODBYE (2:24)

of attention for the Deep Six. The
group adds its warm melodies to the
sound for a solid combo.

BUDDY ACE (Duke 397)
